

Building works have now started at the rear of the Village

Centre, making use of the 'back yard' area which will house the new kitchen. Parish Councillor Brian Nelson is overseeing this development and it is Brian who is chasing the funds to make the whole scheme happen. We had already received a couple of grants and he has just made a successful application of over £14,000 so that the work can proceed. In addition, Brian has made a kind donation for the installation of a disabled toilet, so we are grateful to him for this.

The plan will be that the work will be done in stages; firstly the construction of the shell, followed by the installation of new gents, ladies & disabled toilet blocks; a new store; then the fitting out of a new kitchen. The final works will be the removal of the existing kitchen, thus opening up the Centre into one large area, but split by a dividing curtain. The end result will be that we have more space for our events and the intention is to have it all completed by the end of the year.

Work is coming to an end on the Phase II wall and railings feature in the centre of the Village. It will culminate on Saturday March 11 at 1pm and Villagers are welcome to attend the Official Opening, coupled with a short blessing of the commemorative benches and the burying of the Time Capsule, kindly supplied by Stuart Fraser. All items for its inclusion will be accepted up to 8pm on Friday March 10, to Alwyn Taylor (612452), any Parish Councillor, Bay Horse Inn, School or Village Centre. The Capsule will be filled at the Second Friday meeting on March 10, along with a Beetle Drive.

The following Tuesday will see the inaugural meeting of FORa - Friends of Roughlee's appearance.

We invite all residents to attend and offer their support as we

will be looking for volunteers to undertake a variety of small tasks -

the idea being that we can have on file, names of people who will do an odd job or two, augmenting the work that is already done by the village gardener and the lengthsman. The whole idea is to bring people together to do their bit for the Village, with the aim of winning this year's Best Kept competition. Residents, businesses and the Parish Council made strong representations to United Utilities that disruption be kept to an absolute minimum and it is pleasing that they have listened to our views. A representative from UU will be at the March Parish Council meeting to answer any further concerns.


