

The month of May sees our two organisations hold their AGMs where reports of the year and financial accounts are presented and people take their places for the coming year. The Parish Council and Village Centre Committee work hand in hand to provide Villagers with both an effective running of the village, and for those who want it, an active social life. We think that we do a good job on both counts and, for the size of the Village, much happens over the course of the year. We know that we can't please all of the people the whole of the time and we are not complacent but, as our primary aim is to connect with as many residents as we can, we are constantly seeking ways to encourage more to take a part in village life.

The 'Seniors' are well catered for at the Centre; with their fortnightly Tuesday Club, their Weekly Luncheon and the monthly Age Concern meetings. The 'money-making' Social events are sonably well attended by Villagers but could be better. The annual Parish Council Christmas Lunch and the monthly Second Friday meetings are successful. The fledgling 'Friends of Roughlee' group will add an added boost to our campaign to win the Best Kept Village and the amount of project grants received by the Parish Council, in the last 18 months, is getting close to £100,000 - a massive amount. So, where do we go from here? By the end of the summer, we will have an enlarged Village Centre with a state-ofthe-art kitchen, designed so that we can hold regular, perhaps different types of events. They needn't be money raising affairs; - mother & toddler, gardening clubs, classes whatever, but we do need to keep an eye on fund raising as it costs over £2000 per annum just to keep the doors open. What we ideally need is input from people who can offer a bit of their time to continue to make these things happen, taking on an odd job tidying in the Village or helping in the kichen etc. We will be also looking for people to come forward to help with specific events; this already happens with several of the things we do where residents come together for just one event a year - be it the Village Fayre or the Duck Race or the Ball. We are convinced that many more Villagers would lend a hand in this and just need a little suasion. If you are that way inclined please contact Elaine Todd, James Starkie or any member of the Parish Council or Centre Committee. Alternatively why not come along to the annual Parish Meeting which will take place on the Second Friday of May, the 12th at 8pm, when all the above will be discussed. Supper will be provided, just bring an odd drink or two.
