I like to greet New Year's Day with Mahler's "Resurrection", with those glorious fat chords of the final movement saluting the rebirth from the winter darkness and giving hope that I will meet the problems of the new year with tact, skill and charm; for a change. But my hopes were soon dashed. No sooner had the hangover dissipated than the flu took hold and then, as that retreated under floods of whisky, I twisted a knee.

So the glorious resurrection turned into more of a re-internment and I missed those beautiful days when the hoar frost turned every tree into a crystal and the nights were filled with stars. So, really, it couldn't fail to get better and now fully recovered I can look forward to an exciting year of depression, to owning substantial parts of failing banks and carrying debts heavy enough to burden my children, yea, even unto the fourth generation thereof. But here in the hills of Pendleside, we are made of sterner stuff and will not succumb to the general malaise. We shall look ahead, clear-eyed and resolute, and stride - or hobble, in my case - into 2009 confident that we will rise to the challenges that undoubtedly lie ahead and which your Parish Council will face with their world-renowned clarity of vision, depth of wisdom and foresight.

Parish Councillors invite all Parishioners to the School on Friday 20th March at 7.30 to meet them and your neighbours and to drink a glass of wine or a cup of tea and tell us what you want to see happening in the area. This is primarily a social event but will also give you an opportunity to tell us where we have been going wrong and what we can do to put it right. And for the PC to tell you what we have in mind for the coming year. Please try to come.

As always, there is still a lot to achieve within the Parish and we are currently thinking about all manner of projects;-There is some fencing to be done opposite the church gates, walls to be rebuilt in Sabden Fold, the possibility of re-facing the toilet block with natural stone, more work on the Sparable Wood wetland and the cutting back of overgrowth on the walls on Spen Brook Road, amongst others. If you wish to add anything you are more than welcome to do so.

Gossip in the villages and discussion in the PC in the new year has covered the usual wide range of topics. The cutting back of the trees on Spen Brook road has resulted in a rather unsightly mess but this was unavoidable and should be repaired by future growth, but it has resulted in much improved sight-lines and thus traffic safety. The problems of gritting – or its absence - have occupied much time and may result in a better service. There have been complaints of sheep on the road, but this is the countryside not an extension of suburbia, and these things happen: sheep are adventurous creatures and no great threat to mankind. There has been a considerable amount of fast-food rubbish dumped on Nanny Maud brow and we hope to get a bin placed there, together with a salt bin.

There is still little crime in the area but Phil & Bev were recently instrumental in the arrest of a "lost" lurker on their land and there was panic over what appeared to have been an attempt to pinch the stump of the old gritstone cross at the top of Cross Lane which has now been shown to be a totally legitimate "investigation" by the landowner. But - stay vigilant; in Pendleside even walls can move overnight, as Roger Nowell will testify, and apprehension of the guilty will undoubtedly lead to hangings in Lancaster from which there will be no resurrection.

The Parish Council met in January and its focus over the next couple of months will be to progress replacing the tube type fence opposite the village hall with something more attractive; car park maintenance; landscaping the Barley Bridge embankment and trying to make the best out of the current environmental damage to Boothman Wood. A Parishioner has asked that mobile phone companies are approached to offer them access to the village TV mast, you might have a view on this matter and it will be debated at the February Council meeting. The Council has reviewed its finances and again set a Zero precept tax upon the Parish. The economic downturn is of course a worry but car park receipts are up suggesting more people are staying in the locality rather than travelling to distant hills. However, the Village Hall does need your financial support and I would encourage everyone to attend some of the events this year that raise money for your Hall. The 'Burns Supper' was a sell out and described by our Clerk who attended as "great value for money at £13 for a 4 course meal with whisky tasting, the food was wonderful". The village wireless broadband has been

upgraded to 4Mb which basically means it is now faster, there is room for a couple more households on the system on a first come first served basis so if you are interested contact David Goodger or David Weatherill. Finally, I am pleased to report that Vicky Thorp and Caroline Heap have been confirmed in the permanent roles of Clerk and Financial Officer respectively, bringing both stability and flexibility to these important positions.

It is a deep-seated struggle. Unless we are aware of it, and resist it, we are inevitably pulled towards egotism. We can see the consequences of that every time we watch the news. But St Paul is clear that if we allow ourselves to be transformed spiritually, then the pull of the Spirit is stronger.
