Dear Friends

What have the Romans ever done for us? A famous line from the film 'The Life of Brian.' Quite a lot, it seems, even if you are a member of the Palestinian People's Liberation Front in 30AD. We do get an awful lot of useful things from other cultures.



One thing the Jews have given us is institutional rest.

The Bible opens with a poem about creation which drives to the conclusion - by all means, work hard in the week, but make sure you have a day resting.

Sabbath rest passed into western culture with a little help from Christianity and still is enshrined in things like the working week directive, and the right to holidays - even if the god of the cash till is giving it a hard time. We neglect time spent resting - alone or with our families; during the week or on holiday - at our peril.

Rest isn't the same as doing nothing. The rabbis remind us that even while resting God continues to give life and to regulate the universe and the people in it. Otherwise the whole thing would implode.

Rest is first and foremost a frame of mind, and because of that it can be elusive to some people. We talk about them as 'restless'. Those who master it are recognised as calm and having depth. I think the starting point is doing nothing - a tall order as it takes courage to turn the phone off, and resist the seduction of the 'to-do' list. Then it helps to have a focus, a comfortable place, even a text or a picture. And then be still for a few minutes. If you believe in God it's a good idea to make him part of it through prayer. He did invent rest after all.

If this becomes part of your daily or weekly pattern, you might notice the benefits. The companion of rest is the word 'recreation' - the root of which means being made new.

And Sabbath rest in the Bible points to what God has planned for his people unlimited quality time in his presence.

BARLEY

Planning issues again dominate Council issues and numbers is related to the efforts put in to improving three properties on the old filter beds site next to the es. Village Hall; 3 bedroom, 2 storey stone-built buildings Footnote to scoundrels - the car park pay box is empwith garages, two would face out onto Barley House tied every day! Barn and one would face towards the Water Treatment works.

No plans have yet been posted with Pendle Borough Council but that will happen later in the summer. This is a new-build development closely following on from planning permission to develop UU gaining the Water Treatment Works into seven properties and subsequently selling the site to developers.

The combined effect is 10 new properties which will have a major impact on the Barley Green area. Residents are likely to contest development, arguing that the area is being urbanised and that traffic movements will cause congestion and safety concerns. UU will no doubt use their substantial resources to ensure they get the best return they can from a site they no longer require. It is apparent that they want to squeeze every penny they can get from the area.

Building work has not yet started at the Water Treatment Works. The developer has informed the Council that an amendment to the planning permission has been submitted proposing the inclusion of wood burning stoves with associated smoke flues, which would vent out of the rear of the roof. This proposal can be viewed on the Pendle BC website and is The Council is still currently being considered. awaiting a decision from LCC regarding completing the installation of block paving on our footways. We offered to fund 50% of the costs and I am surprised they have not snapped our hands off.

I am sure you have noticed the popularity of the village has increased, a full car park plus cars filling the road space is a regular event at the weekends. We recently took £2,103 in one month from the car park, a record to date. The village is attracting events for cyclists, runners and ramblers; the sponsored pub walk was a new event last week which attracted many new people to the area. I think the increased visitor

The Council is settling in well with a refreshing involvement and contribution from its new members which bodes well for the future. It is our intention this year to allocate specific tasks to individual councillors who will take direct responsibility for the projects we have planned and for some of the routine work in which we get involved.

We have made an application for capital grant support to PBC - additional to our budgeted expenditure - in respect of resurfacing the paths between Osborne Terrace, Gorrell Close and the playing fields, replacing the metal benches in Sparable Wood, and creating a small garden at the junction of Gorrell and Spen Brook Road.

Other funds will be used to continue the work on the toilet garden in Newchurch and the replanting of the church gates plot and finishing the work on the track between upper and lower playing field.

So there is a lot to do and we are confident that all will be completed before winter.

We hope for success in the Best Kept Village competition and urge all in Newchurch in Pendle and Spen Brook to contribute in any way they can to cleaning and tidying, concentrating on the things we can do rather than the bigger problems - like Spen Brook mill which now seems likely, with a new layout to go before Barrowford and Western planning meeting in August.

Your council - who thank all in the parish for the excellent support they received in the recent election - will monitor this and keep you informed.
