Dear Friends

What's the word of the year? According to the compilers of The Oxford English Dictionary, it's 'squeezed middle'! The full OED definition reads: "Squeezed Middle: the section of society regarded as particularly affected by inflation, wage freezes and cuts in public spending during a time of economic difficulty, consisting principally of those on low or middle incomes". At the same time the High Pay Commission has found that top executives' pay has increased by 4000% over the past thirty years with a negative effect on the economy. The usual explanation is that without such high remuneration, these 'top performers' would go and work elsewhere.

It's a feature of modern life worth reflecting on at this time of the year. The way of the world leads us to put a high value on wealth and its acquisition. Christmas shines a spotlight on these values. It's not saying that wealth creation is wrong. A biblical view of wealth sees its value in creating well-being for society. But Jesus is clear that while being a benefit, wealth can also contain hidden dangers.

Idolatry is the number one sin in the Bible. But forget falling down in front of statues. Idolatry is when we put material things higher than our need for somewhere trustworthy to locate our spiritual needs. It seems to me that many of the shapers in society worship high salaries and status symbols. I do worry for their spiritual and moral health that they need to find their security in material things, and to such an extent.

Contrast this with God's modus operandi. A 'chief executive' with no equal inside or outside of the universe, who lays all his privileges aside to experience human frailty from the inside. Not in an palace but in a shack; not as a great leader but as a servant; not in happy old age, but in an early violent death. And why? So that our values might be challenged; that love and selfless commitment might be seen as wealthier options than accumulating things.

The story of Christmas is not a comforting tale for children. It is a wake-up call to all who need to listen.

Happy Christmas; and a blessed and 'wealthy' New Year!

2012 SEES THE 400TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE SO CALLED WITCHES' TRIALS IN LANCASTER. It is now the intention to appoint a small panel of Roughlee-ers who will oversee the final design. Colin Nutter and Bruce Hartley have kindly agreed to prepare the groundworks. BARLEY

You may or may not have been aware that an application has been received by Pendle Council to construct three houses on the old filter beds Barley Green. Planning officers are recommending refusal but only on the grounds of design. The documents can be viewed online, using the case number 13/11/0531P. The actual decision will be made at Barrowford and Western Parishes meeting at 7pm Thursday 8th December. Barley Parish Council has submitted a letter of objection on planning, traffic sight lines and listed building grounds and so too have some residents, but this may not be enough!! Please contact Cllr Goodger (T 604301) if you have any comments.

Pendle Council is also holding a public consultation on the Core Strategy, a new planning document that will have a major influence on physical change in Pendle's towns, villages and countryside over the next 15 years. It also indicates where and how much housing, retail and employment development we wish to see in the Borough in the coming years, as well as highlighting those areas we wish to protect from development.

The Council want to be sure that their new policies will encourage development that helps to support the key priorities for the area, and directs growth to where it is most needed. All comments will be carefully considered and the Core Strategy will be amended as necessary. It is suggested that the new policies could have a significant effect on Barley and your consideration and comment would be appreciated. The six-week public consultation ends on Monday 12th December 2011 so it very important to get your views in. The Show 'Oliver' was an outstanding success. Audiences of more than 150 people packed the chapel in the afternoon and evening. The show raised £1,300 so that the children of Kailahun could have a extra bag of rice at Christmas. The play was produced, directed and starred our local young people, of whom we should be very proud. The next event is Barley to Bethlehem. There are still vacancies for shepherds and angels!!
