## Dear Friends

Service is a challenging word.

When I started as a vicar in the 90s, there were elderly people in the parish who had started their working life in service. They were employed as servants in big houses. I'm not sure how



accurately Downton Abbey and Upstairs, Downstairs reflect what that life was like, but I was amazed at the length of their working day. Even Sunday was not a day of rest. Fires still had to be lit, and breakfasts served. And there was the expectation that the servants would also fit two church services in! But invariably they spoke warmly about those times and with affection about their employers.

Few of us would like to see ourselves as servants. We want to lead, to be important. And yet many of us are servants. Most working people in this country are employed in service industries. Vicars are ministers in God's church, and the word 'minister' is a Latin word for a servant. What goes on in our churches is described as a service. There is a phrase in the old Prayer Book which describes worship as 'our bounden duty and service'.

So what can be said for being a servant?

Years ago I was influenced by the thinking of Robert Greenleaf, a Quaker and director of Management Research at AT&T in the USA. He put together the idea of servant and leader and came up with a model of a boss as a servant-leader. His ideas are heavily influenced by his Christian faith, but also by a sharp business mind, and they we adopted not just by AT&T but other major corporations.

He said that a great leader is first experienced as a servant to others, and that true leadership emerges from those whose primary motivation is a deep desire to help others. In June we will be celebrating the Queen's Diamond Jubilee. Servant-leader is not a bad way into understanding her success. There will lots of events to mark the occasion. There will be a Service of Thanksgiving at St Mary's on June 3rd, at 10.30am. Please mark it in your diaries and come along to give thanks for her service to the people of this country.

Wednesday 9th May is the ANNUAL PARISH MEETING. It's not a council meeting but a meeting of the parishioners and local organisations. Its purpose is to celebrate local achievements and the Council will report on progress and consult with you on any current issues in the community such as improvement projects and planning issues etc. Every resident is welcome including the Village Hall Committee, Young Farmers, WI, Church groups and local businesses. It is your opportunity to put ideas forward - they will be recorded and duly considered by the Council or one of the above groups. The meeting is scheduled for 45mins to 1 hour and is followed by wine & nibbles and the opportunity to chat with neighbours, friends and acquaintances.

We have much to discuss including the forthcoming Diamond Jubilee Carnival to be held on Monday 4th June at Whitehough field. A lot of work is going in to making this a memorable occasion, bringing together local people from Barley, Newchurch and Roughlee. We need to discuss how we can contribute to the procession which will open the carnival and the events that are planned such as the inter village tug of war competition. I hope we can organise a few floats between us which can reflect the occasion, these can be wagons, tractors, cars, horse and cart etc. or anything you can come up with to join the procession from Barley to the carnival field via Thorneyholme. Maybe some 1950's fancy dress, I am sure some of you will have the genuine articles in the wardrobe! Planning issues have dominated the recent business of the Council and we have raised objections to the construction of three houses on the old filter beds site at Barley Green as we believe it would over-development and urbanise the enclave and we are objecting to the development of a camp site at Boothman Wood as we do not think it will benefit the area. I will cover these issues in the report I present and residents can offer their views.

So come to the Parish Meeting in just over a week and support our community groups and even have your say if you want to. We won't take minutes or waste hours and I will accept it if you start looking at your watches if we go on longer than an hour, just as long as you don't raise it to your ear to check if it has stopped!
