Barley is the winner of the Lancashire Best Kept Village (Hamlet Class) for 2013! pipping our neighbours in Newchurch and Roughlee and beating all thirteen entrants in the competition. The village has looked clean, tidy and looked after all summer and this was clearly was appreciated by the judges and I am glad that the efforts of many villagers have been recognised. The summer has been good so we have hosted over 25,000 visitors and still kept our highways and byways pretty much trash free, that is only achieved by us all doing our bit! The competition is designed to encourage community effort and involvement in keeping villages and their facilities tidy and well maintained and I believe the competition does provide a focus but in the end we all benefit from looking after our own patch. On behalf of the Parish Council I would like to thank the villagers and businesses who contributed in some way and on a personal note to thank John Connor who was the lead Councillor on this project and Frank Wilkinson who kept on top of our landscape areas as our lengthsman.

The appearance of Barley Green has now changed for good, the established conifers and holly bushes next to the Village Hall have been stripped out to reveal three new houses which are structurally complete and I expect fittings, sale signs and new residents will soon follow. Times are changing in Barley Green.

Lancashire CC has given us a new Dam Head Bridge joining us once again with Roughlee after a six week construction project and road closure. The works went well with only a couple of days needed to overcome the surprise of the beams being cast a little longer than expected, a much easier problem to solve than if they had been too short! After LCC consulted with Roughlee and our Borough Councillor, the design was changed to include attractive white railings to match the old bridge and it all looks just fine to me. We now have a bridge that should last over 100 years (not the surface of course) for the cost not much more than a new Porche 11 Turbo.

On 30th September our oldest resident Alf Carpenter was 90 years old. Alf was in the Royal Navy in WWII and has recently been awarded the Artic Star Medal commemorating his service on escort ships on the very hazardous convoys to Russia. Alf's ship the HMS LAMBOURNE was torpedoed and sunk, Alf was one of only 14 from the crew who survived and only 4 are alive today. We hope Alf will be able to continue to attend our Remembrance Day event with his medal proudly displayed.

On 6th September a capacity crowd were entertained by the Houghton Weavers with their well known mix of humour & song. The event was a great success & enjoyed by all they will be making a welcome return in March 2014. Watch this space for the date.

In the midst of economic gloom it's good to see that Pendleside has again done well in the Best Kept Village competition; Barley wins the Hamlet section - congratulations! - and Roughlee, Spen Brook and Newchurch all come within the top 8 in their categories. It shows how much effort and time we collectively put into making our "economically depressed" part of the country beautiful and tidy. There's always more that could be done but the Parish Council is grateful to those who worked so hard. In this context it should be remembered how much work is done by our parish Lengthsmen; their jobs are not glamorous - these are the people who mend gates and stiles, clear drainage and undergrowth, sometimes in dreadful weather - but they make it possible to use our paths and wander our hills safely. The PC pays £750 pa to be part of this service and we get our money's worth - and some! Staying on the economy, PBC's deficit will eventually filter down to us and we will have to consider how much we, individually through our Council Tax, are prepared to pay for services which, until now, we have taken for granted. Like mowing our fields, clearing our paths, keeping our toilets open. If doing all this cost each of us in Goldshaw £20 pa, would you consider it worth it? We will need to make these choices soon.

The PC has had a number of complaints about dog mess on the playing fields. We are considering making the upper field into a dog-free area but we do ask dog owners to clean up after their pets and to use the bins provided. The Appeal against the Spen Brook MIII decision rumbles on; the Inspector has ruled that this is not an Environmental Impact Site, so one of our potential defences has fallen. I fear that the national need for housing – although not necessarily applicable in East Lancs – will not help. We should learn more about this – and possible alternatives – through the autumn.

There has been discussion in the parish about the future of this magazine; I would hate to see it go or be diminished to a single scrappy sheet. Cllr Starkie does a great job in collating it but needs more contributions. It may be that we have to widen its scope to include more gossip and comment. What do you think? Do you read it?
