Dear Friends

I've just got back from a few days away. I stayed on a farm just a few miles outside Brecon, with wonderful views of the Brecon Beacons when you could see them. Signs of the ravages of recent weather were everywhere – field paths under thick mud, water meadows where the Usk had broken its banks. And yet optimism when the sun shone. An odd job man happily informed me that Tuesday was the



sun shone. An odd job man happily informed me that Tuesday was the first day it hadn't rained since Christmas. I didn't have the heart to remind him that it had actually rained that morning. The sense that maybe spring was on its way, and that the bad news of floods and storms was past, was mirrored in news about the economy. Inflation down, employment up. Maybe we have turned the corner, and maybe we can look forward to enjoying the benefits of growth once more. But if you ever needed a reminder that we are still in it together – whatever that meant – I had it sitting in a pub in Cardiff reading a newspaper article about Matt Barlow. This Matt Barlow is the CEO of 'Christians against Poverty.' He is an unlikely champion of the poor. He went to university with one thought in mind - securing a good job and making lots of money. His mistake was to fancy a girl who suggested coming to church. Anxious to please, he went and had a conversion experience. He saw his new Christian identity leading him into a life of service to those in need. The article made for thought provoking reading in a week when bankers' bonuses were making news again. The Christians against Poverty helpline had 155 calls last week, a 50% increase on this time last year. The predominant difficulties are linked to benefit changes, and people sinking into debt with payday loans just to buy food. We are about to embark on that time of the year Christians call Lent. Traditionally Christians practice self-denial for the good of their souls. For years now I have seen it as a time to say no to myself and yes to people in need. Generally it is cutting down on wine with meals to send money to Christians in Jerusalem. It needn't be that. But I think the principle is a good one - showing compassion for others in a practical/financial way. So why not? One less bottle of wine at £6.99, or one less pint at £2.50. [Editor's note; £2.50?? -it's obviously a long time since John bought a pint!] Or if you don't share my vices, the cost of a magazine or a bar of chocolate would make a real difference to someone you may never know.

At Barrowford and Western Parishes meeting 6 February re Spenbrook Mill Development The plan for ten three bedroom residential units in the former mill building, plus seventeen five bedroom detached houses to the west, and one four bedroom unit. Eight local residents spoke at length to oppose the plans, for various reasons. A proposal was made by a Borough Councillor to reject the application, was seconded by another, all were in favour. Mr Mousdale Executive Director of Borough of Pendle said final judgment would be made at Planning and Development control meeting at Nelson Town Hall 24 February 7pm this would be an open meeting.

TOILET BLOCK To keep the toilets or not after a lengthy discussion the consensus was that we keep them open. We are hopeful of any offers of help with cleaning in order to keep costs down to a minimum.

Barley Parish Council

February is now behind us and we can start moving in to Spring. We should be getting a breath of fresh air and the pressure of the new year's resolutions has either incorporated itself into healthy habits or dropped by the wayside. If it is the latter then with the recent drier and milder weather this is a good time to try again. As I have reported previously, times are hard down at the Town Hall and our Borough Councillors have decided they are no longer able to support public toilets, so they are to close unless the local Parish or Town Councils are willing and able to offer the convenience of "spending a penny" to its visitors. This has created a dilemma for us – our parishioners do not use them but those living in the village centre do not want to see our visitors bobbing in and out of the bushes to do their thing. We have been engaged in discussions with senior PBC officers, which initially went well and we thought an agreement was made where

Barley PC would take on the sponsibility for our car park toilets, with some limited financial support from them. However, since then they have reneged on the agreement and are now offering meagre financial support which is limited to two years. It appears we have been "dumped on" and the Council will have to look at how we can "raise a penny" in the future to maintain this facility. The planning application relating to the Barley Mow is being recommended for approval by officers and will be considered, in public, by Councillors at the next meeting of the Barrowford & WP on Thursday March 6 at 7pm. The proposal for timber lap fencing outside the three new houses at Barley Green has been
