Dear Friends

I love this time of year. The days lengthening and warming up. The grass greening and the field paths drying out. Lambs and calves in the meadows. It's a time when I try to get around the farms. I am always amazed at how unpredictable livestock farming can be. Yes, you can make decisions about when to put the tups in, and you can



be thorough in looking after animal health and the pastures. But then so much is beyond control – the weather, the prices, the foxes, and the proverbial ability for sheep to drop dead for no apparent reason. The only way of coping is to be prepared, to be flexible, and to be philosophical. It contrasts with modern society's approach to life where we like to be in control, and plan so that risks are minimised. But even then, as the recent banking crisis has shown, total control is a bit of fantasy. Similarly we have high expectations of our longevity and those close to us. The 23rd Psalm is clear about the answer. Using the image of God as a shepherd guiding his sheep to the best pasture and the stillest drinking places, it does not pretend that we will always avoid places of spiritual and emotional darkness, but even then God is there as a companion and a support. Finally we can look forward to God receiving us a generous host at a banquet in his presence.

On May 10th, we shall be holding our annual Thanksgiving for Lambing service. For our farmers it is a time to celebrate the end of a time of intensely hard work and share experiences. For the rest of us, it is an opportunity to give thanks for a major local industry and visit a farm. It is also a time to celebrate that 'through all the changing scenes of life' we have a firm basis for our trust. Do join us.


After some tribulations a new clock has been ordered for the village garage and we hope you will soon get used to the Big Ben chimes punctuating our days and nights.

Himalayan balsam and Japanese knotweed are an invasive species to the UK, introduced by the Victorians as ornamental plants. Balsam is spreading through Lancashire and it is well established in Barley and with us sitting at the head of the Pendle Water catchment, we act as a seed source for the rest of the river and it is therefore a high priority for control work. Many of you will know that over the past few years there have been some balsam bashing sessions with volunteers and landowners carrying out work; pulling up the balsam but a more planned and organised approach is required. The Ribble Rivers Trust is a registered charity who work to restore flora and wildlife in areas around the Ribble and its tributaries and this year they wish to raise awareness and increase the level of activity in Barley and make a significant impact on the quantity of balsam in and around the village. They have the expertise for tackling balsam and we think this is an excellent opportunity for the Parish Council, landowners, residents and volunteers to support them and hopefully make a real difference. This is just the start - we intend to follow up with much more information on Himalayan balsam and Japanese knotweed (which we also have) and the plans to tackle them. We look forward to a great volunteer response! Heap
