The IoS gave us with its Happy List, people who, 'without thought of personal gain, give back and help others, rather than themselves.' It includes a 93-year-old who has raised more than £100,000 for Age UK by dressing as a bee; and a teacher who donated a kidney to one of his pupils. No doubt we would view such people with admiration, but would we envy them or want to be on that list?

Wealth is an interesting driver in human aspiration. I am sure each of us, no matter how wealthy we are, would imagine life being better if we had a little more wealth. And with wealth comes status and power. So it is not just about materialism. It is about self-esteem. However the Book of Proverbs (22.1) advises us, If you have to choose between a good reputation and great wealth, choose a good reputation. Virtue is making a comeback in philosophy departments as a model for ethics. At its basis is Aristotle's view that virtue is a habit, and we become virtuous by doing virtuous acts. Which means while making untold wealth is beyond the means of many of us, being virtuous is not. And the key to success is to doing virtuous acts.

I believe we are not on our own when we try to get into the virtue habit. God can give us the boost we need and produce in us, love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, humility, and self-control. We may not get into the IoS, but our names may just be in the Book of Life.

Roughlee School

Children at Roughlee school have spent the last half term working in a new topic based way. Infant children have been studying the topic "How does your garden grow". This has involved the children in lots of creative work such as making origami flowers, as well as planting their own crops which they are looking after and hope to be able to harvest and eat in due course. They also know all about dandelions which they hope will not grow in the vegetable plot!

The junior children have been following the "Walk like an Egyptian" topic. This has involved finding out about the country of Egypt and where in the world it is, what mummification is and what goes into canopic jars! The children have had fun making their own mummies and bookmarks with their name written in hieroglyphics. A rap song covering the topic has been learnt and is to be performed at a special assembly at the end of the half term.

Our new Reception children will be coming to St. Mary's for their 3 induction meetings, beginning on the 18th June. We are very pleased to welcome all eight of them to our school family.

Once again our children were fortunate enough to go on another trip whilst the school was used as a Polling Station. On Thursday 22nd May the children, staff & helpers visited Harlow Carr. This is a vast garden dominated by water, stone and woodland and is very much part of the surrounding Yorkshire landscape. The children visited the Bramall Learning Centre which is a stunning resource for schools to explore all that Harlow Carr has offer. Throughout the day tailored workshops were delivered by education officers, based on the site. Key Stage 1 enjoyed a workshop called 'Vegetable Stew' where they found out where in the world their food comes from and how it is made. Key Stage 2 found out about the artist Escher, looking at the Mathematics involved in his drawings.
