Dear Friends

July 1914 must have been a strange time. The news of the assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand and his wife in Sarajevo on June 28th had just broken. Governments were wondering what would happen next and who would make the first move. Four weeks of

suspense, and then Austria-Hungary broke the stalemate invading Serbia. Britain entered the war on August 4th, when Germany invaded neutral Belgium and Luxembourg. It was the beginning of four years of conflict which resulted in over 37 million casualties among military and civilians – a list which continues to grow as farmers in Flanders turn over the occasional unexploded ordnance. The Europe that resulted was changed forever. And the seeds of a second world war were sown.

One hundred years on we are commemorating the events of the First World War. It is important to be clear what that means. War is not a cause for celebration. Events of 1914-18 could have been avoided or mitigated if people had chosen differently. We should approach the centenary with humility. At the same time many people went to war with some idealism and willingness to risk for others. Communities, especially in the north west, had to live with the loss of loved ones. So our commemoration should reflect honouring the sacrifices of so many people. It should also encourage a desire for peace through a just and compassionate foreign policy.

At St Mary's we will be marking the centenary on the weekend of August 2nd-3rd. The church will be open for anyone who wants to come and spend some time in silence. There will be an opportunity to record family members affected by the conflict. On August 4th, the church will again be open. Leading up to 11pm there will be a short service when the commemorative candle will be extinguished reflecting Sir Edward Grey's comment that 'The lamps are going out all over Europe'. Do please use these opportunities as you feel moved.

Barley Parish Council

Just a reminder that the judging for the Best Kept village started at the beginning of this month and the Parish Council is busy, under the vigilant guidance of Cllr Connor. All the benches, the notice board and the toilets have been given a smart lick of paint and the planters in the turning circle and around the cabin have been filled with decorative plants. all for our own satisfaction as well as the visitors to our pleasant village. As has already been mentioned in previous newsletters, the Parish Council has taken over the responsibility for the cleaning and maintenance of the toilets by the car park due to the cutbacks required by Pendle but I am very pleased to say that the standard of cleanliness has improved dramatically and is now much admired, thanks to the diligence of our local helper Frank and now Stuart. A big 'thank you' to them for all their efforts...it is much appreciated.

The Parish Council called an extraordinary meeting to discuss the planning application at Higher Whitehough (Pendle ref 13/14/0251P) for a two storey extension to the rear, a single storey to the side, front insertion of new window openings and the creation of a detached garage with play room above. Concern was expressed, in particular, to the proposal of a new garage remote from the house in what is an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. This seemed to contradict accepted planning policy and our comments have been forwarded to the local planning department to this effect.

A project that was first decided upon over two years ago (before the National Cycle Race - remember that?) was the restoration of the finger post at the 'top' of the village at Annel Cross. I am pleased to report that is now in place and if you haven't seen it yet, it looks splendid, even at night, as when you flash your lights at it, it flashes back - very clever!!

Welcome to the new occupiers at Salt Pie Farm and to those in the three new houses on Barley Green which have now been sold.

Hopefully, all will support the excellent opportunities, facilities and events in the Village Hall where everyone is welcome.

ROUGHLEE WW1 MEMORIAL STONE & PLAQUE UNVEILING

A few years, Roughlee resident Clarice Holmes mooted the idea of having some sort of memorial to those who served and came back, as well as those that sadly didn't return. Unlike our neighbouring villages Roughlee does not have a war memorial as none of its sons was lost in battle.

We have pondered this for a while and have now decided to honour all those that gave, not just those in the armed forces - many stayed here on the land and in reserved occupations.

Cllr. James Starkie has designed a plaque which will be unveiled to the public on Sunday August 3 at 2pm. It will be fitted on an aged piece of stone, kindly donated by Stuart Milligan, in the verge close to 'alice'. It is being paid for out of Roughlee's share of the profits from the 2012 QEII Jubilee fund. Revd. John Hallows will lead the service, in the company of the Worship the Mayor, the Royal British Legion and other dignitaries. It is also planned to continue the opening at the Village Centre afterwards with some form of entertainment and all local villagers are very welcome to attend.
