Barley Parish Council

The big issue in Barley just now is the congestion in the centre of the village and vehicles using the bus turning circle as a car park. The Parish Councillors have spoken to residents and the overwhelming consensus is that the bus turning circle should not be used as a car park. And we did well in the BKV competition!

The PC is well aware that the congestion is being caused by the contractors' vehicles that are working on the Barley Mow and that is to be expected. Within those vehicles may be expensive tools to do their jobs and they need those tools to hand and stored securely where they can see them. The presence of the contractors' vehicles is causing the Barley Garage, residents and visitors to use the turning circle as a parking area and so an array of vehicles are parked there through most the day.

The position of the PC is to tolerate this situation until the Barley Mow is finished and then we will expect the support of these businesses in not parking on our "village square" and maintaining the area as a turning area. The problem we might face is that people get used to seeing vehicles parking there and think it is a car park. It might therefore take a while to get back to a no parking zone but if

need be we will liaise with our colleagues at the County Council and seek parking enforcement powers. On a similar vane, I am told that the residents of Pendle Row have lobbied Pendle BC for a residents parking scheme.

On the subject of parking, the PC will again be considering investing in a macadam access road through the car park and you are welcome to attend the debate and decision making on October 8.

We came second in the Best Kept Village competition this year and we were the winner in the AONB competition. This is a great result given the issues I have reported above and thanks to all those who have done to every resident who has done their bit.

In the last issue I asked if anybody would be interested in writing a chronical of the history of the village based upon the minutes of the Parish Council meetings between 1994 and the present. I got no takers. So if anybody is thinking this might be an interesting history project through the dark winter nights then please step forward and create a story of events which would be of historical interest to us all and those after us. Please give me a call if you are interested in this project.

The final balsam-bashing session was a bit of a disappointment as only three villagers turned up and we were outnumbered by conservation

volunteers who did. We need more of you next year! That said we have made really good progress this year in turning the Himalayan Balsam and you will see less of this pervasive plant next year. Similarly you might have noticed the Japanese Knotweed has been decimated on the way to Whitehough and we hope another injection treatment next year will see it off for good.
