Dear Friends

I expect Remembrance Sunday this year will be especially poignant given the centenary of the outbreak of the First World War. One of the features of the commemoration has been the focus on people's stories, soldiers and civilians. We have a sense of connectedness with that generation in the way we are remembering.



Being connected with people separated from us by so many years is a powerful

experience. To try and get inside the lives of other people brings us into a sort of intimacy. We ask what it must have been like; how they felt; what were their fears and their dreams. There is the risk of being sentimental or we can fix our attention on the violence. But it can also challenge us to think about our response to the losses and why wars happen.

It is also a legitimate thing to do. After all, many of those people came from villages like ours. And with a bit of imagination we can connect also to ordinary people in Germany, Austria, France and Russia who were also caught up in the Great War. It may not be a close connection, but with imagination we can see events as others saw them and feel compassion, rather than hatred, for those who are technically enemies.

How we feel about our enemies is a challenge today as well. We know only too well that there are people planning to harm not only our armed forces but also our civilians. What should be our attitude to them? The danger is that anger determines our response, but that can obscure the positive values of our country. I was recently speaking to an Army Reserve Padre. On tour in Iraq he had gone from the mortuary where he had prayed over the body of a young British soldier killed in action, to the hospital where another British soldier, a nurse, was treating an Iraqi insurgent with as much compassion and respect as a coalition casualty. It illustrated for him that when we see injustice, our response should be firm but it should not undermine the sort of nation we aspire to be.

Jesus once said, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate, bless those who curse, and pray for those who ill-treat you.

Charles Dickens enjoyed pubs and so he would have enjoyed Barley in 2014. The Pendle Inn is no bleak house and testimony comes from two prestigious awards they picked up recently. The pub was runner-up in the "Lancashire Life Traditional Pub of the Year" competition, beating over two thousand pubs in Lancashire to reach the prestigious awards ceremony at the Manchester Hilton last week. Well done and congratulations to all involved. The second award was a place in the "Good Beer Guide 2015" reflecting the diversity and quality of real ale's on offer.

Great Expectations might have summed up the anticipation of Charles regarding the re-opening of the Barley Mow. The doors open proper in mid November but you might have called in on Halloween night for a one evening only opening to give local people a chance to see the place before it formally opens. I am sure it will also do well.

We all know pubs that are boarded up, playing fields sold to developers and village shops sold as second homes etc. These local tragedies destroy the notion of community by removing the very amenities that bring people together and so I am pleased that the Barley Mow is another amenity addition to the village.

The annual Remembrance Service will start at 1030 inside the Village Hall on Tuesday 11th November, leading on to a short ceremony and two minutes silence at the Memorial Stone at 1100. Vicar John Hallows, and hopefully a bugler, will contribute to the service and wreaths will be laid – please come along and wear your poppy in memory of those who gave everything.

We hope you like the WW Commemoration bench seat we have recently installed.

At the last PC meeting we considered investing in a macadam access road through the car park as a remedy for the extensive potholes it suffers. The Council decided not to pursue this option and other solutions are being investigated.

Rose Turner has volunteered to write a chronical of the history of the village based upon the minutes of the Parish Council meetings between 1994 and the present, adding to earlier work by Adam Metcalfe. The Archbishop of York, The Most Rev. Dr John Sentamu, will visit our Diocese in Lancashire in early November for two days. The highlight of the visit, which takes place on November 4 and 5, will be an evangelistic mission event 'Light in Darkness' to be held at Blackpool Tower Ballroom on November 4 at 7.30pm.

The Archbishop aims to challenge us to live the Faith here in Lancashire and will speak from his own experiences growing up in poverty in Uganda. It's sure to be a fabulous and exciting evening and the aim is to get as many as possible to attend from our churches of course; but the Archbishop, a gifted and inspiring speaker, also wants people to bring friends and family so they can hear the Good News, perhaps for the first time.

Katie gave us a very informative presentation of the system, how it works, also the training that is required, before anyone would be able to be recruited as a Community First Responder. Councillors were given detailed answers to all questions raised, including the purchase, storage and use of a defibrillator.

After a discussion it was agreed that Parish Cllr. John Parsons and Borough Councillor James Starkie would arrange for a presentation and training course on an evening to be held at Roughlee Village Centre on January 28 at 7pm for anyone in the area who would be interested in the Heart Start scheme to attend. Up to 30 people can be accommodated at any one time.
