Dear Friends



The next few days will continue to be dominated by one major story affecting all of us – which party or parties are going to form the next government?

Gone, it seems, is the two party option. Now there is a plethora of choices. Publicly the large parties talk down coalition but who knows? As well as the big issues like the economy, the NHS, welfare reforms, there are the additional forces of cynicism and nationalism. What impact can we have on May 7th? Is it surprising that one feature of elections in recent years, local as well as general, has been the rise of voter apathy?

So how should we respond? Winston Churchill once stated, "Indeed it has been said that democracy is the worst form of Government except for all those other forms that have been tried from time to time...." We have an opportunity with our vote to exercise democracy. But which outcomes do we want?

Like it or not, how we vote is a statement about our own vision and values. What do I want from the next government in terms of my needs, wider society's, the nation's and even the world's needs? And importantly any vision has to be grounded in realism. Who is best placed to deliver what we believe is best for ourselves and society?

The Bible can help. Three things are required of us - to do justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with our God (Micah 6.6). Not a manifesto, but a guide. It doesn't tell us which candidate or party to vote for. But it may work as a spotlight as we review our options as we cast our vote.

2015 Election update

Thursday May 7 is Election Day this year, and the Polling Stations at Barley Village Hall,
Newchurch School and Roughlee Village Centre will be open from 7am to 10pm.

You will be voting for one of the five candidates in the General Election and one of the two candidates for Pendle Borough Council. In Barley, votes will also be cast for seven Parish Councillors out of nine candidates. Nominations for Goldshaw Booth and Roughlee did not meet the target number and the vacancies will be filled by co-option.

Publisher Comment: Whilst it is likely that Roughlee will fill their vacancy, I appeal to residents of **Newchurch & Sabden Fold** to consider taking up the vacancy for Goldshaw Booth PC. This has been vacant for over a year and whilst the Council runs perfectly well, there is no one from these two hamlets.



The Pendle Family Running Festival will be held over Saturday and Sunday 18/9th July. There will be a 10k road race, a half marathon road race on the Saturday.

Councillor Comment: Chairman of Barley Parish Council, Derek Heap and I met with the organisers requesting reduced times for the road closures and this was accepted. More details will follow but, on Saturday July 18, the road from Whitehough to Roughlee will be closed from around 0915-0945 and then for a similar period up Stang Top Road to Black Moss Road. At the time of going to press there will be no closures at all from Annel Cross back to Barley and there will be no closures at all affecting Newchurch and Jinny Lane.

On Easter Saturday we found ourselves in a visitor storm, it was a glorious day attracting bank holiday visitors to our footways, byways and hostelries plus well over 500 junior and senior runners to races on our fells and fields. Not many saw this coming, certainly the Parish Council was not aware of the major race event. The main issue became parking — we had cars parked all the way down to Thorneyholme and a collection of inconsiderate people parking all over the village constricting the flow of traffic — they could have been visitors or runners. The debris was also a problem.

This issue dominated our last meeting and the PC now recognises we will have to be more proactive in event management in the village — an issue we never even thought about until the last couple of years. The number and scale of events have increased dramatically as well as the number of day visitors.

This involves meeting organisers and liaising with PBC and the Police etc. and we are getting quite a taster as we get involved in the "Pendle Family Running Festival" planned for 18th July. This event had road closures planned with LCC/
Police which would cut the village off from traffic for 4 hours — the PC and Cllr. Starkie have worked with the organ-

isers to significantly reduce the period of the closures. You must now know there are Parliamentary and Borough election on 7th May. On the same day there will be an election for the Parish Council. All current councillors have put their names forward and there are two new candidates. The green voting paper will have nine names on it and you will be asked to vote for a maximum of seven people. The Count is staggered and I know you will be watching Mr Paxman on the Friday afternoon, making his exit pole predictions and following the Barley Swingometer!

Goldshaw Booth Parish Council

At our March meeting the Council discussed the

Spen Brook Mill Variation of Conditions notice. We objected to specific changes to conditions and this item was on the agenda at Barrowford and Western Parishes meeting on April 1st. At the meeting, three of our Councillors spoke about our concerns.

The Chairman of B&WP proposed that the variation of conditions be granted because of the timescale and this was agreed. To say we were disappointed is an understatement.

Planning Application 13/15/0110P Douglas Hall Cottage. An inaccuracy regarding the vehicular access was noted and this has been notified to Pendle Planning Department.

Complaints have been made again with regard to dog fouling in and around the area - owners take notice! Pendle Environmental Action Group will be planting wild flower seeds in the Millennium Garden. There will not be an election for Parish Councillors in Goldshaw Booth as the number of persons nominated is fewer than the number of vacancies, this means there is one vacancy on the council. Our next meeting, The Annual General Meeting, will commence at 6.30pm not 7pm on May 12th
