Dear Friends

Trinity is a peculiar word. For some people it may mean no more than the summer term in certain universities. For fans of The Matrix it is a dynamic heroine. For church-goers it might be the way of counting Sundays between Easter and Advent. Some people may even recognise it as that idiosyncratic belief in God that marks out Christians.



As such it is a minefield. The history of Christianity has been marked by misunderstandings and disagreements about how God, Father, Son and Spirit, could possibly be three and yet one. And it has caused confusion in Christianity's relations with other religions. It is so counter-intuitive that it is either true or a fiction dreamed up by people on mind-altering substances. You can probably guess where I stand on that one.

But for me there is more to it than numerical musings. What it points to is that at the heart of Ultimate Reality there is relationship, differentiation and generosity. Those three qualities are fundamental not just to theology, but to human society. We know only too well that people are not the same, and differences can be a source of tension and even conflict. And yet diversity among people, whether it is of race, language, belief systems, or origin, needn't divide people from each other. Diversity can enrich and inspire.

So many stories in our world today reflect a world of division. Wars, massacres, refugees result from attempts to impose uniformity based of a tribal, religious, political or economic identity. The trio of relationship, differentiation and generosity is the antidote. Imagine a world in which people of every kind found a place in a harmonious relationship in which each person responded to the other in a spirit of generosity. If Ultimate Reality is like this, then it should be our aspiration for this-worldly reality.

Our school nurse visited to give her annual healthy lifestyles talk. She spoke to the year 6 children about growing up healthily and the Reception children about healthy eating.

SAFE LANES IN PENDLESIDE

PCSO Di Bioletti was the guest speaker at the Safe Lanes meeting at the end of April. She informed the group that the number of horse related road traffic accidents and near misses reported to the police is on the increase. Last November two riders were injured, one seriously, one horse died and another was injured in a road traffic collision in the Ribble Valley.

A keen horsewoman herself, PCSO Bioletti was familiar with the dangers encountered by riders when out on the roads. To raise public awareness she had organised a ride on Sunday 26 April from the livery yard where she stables her mount, Basil. Two Mounted Police Officers and their trusty steeds, Freckleton and Elswick, came along and escorted a group of riders on a circular ride involving narrow country lanes and a busier road.



Part of the route took them past the Safe Lanes traffic mirror at Black Hill cross roads and on towards Higham, passing a set of Safe Lanes signs giving advance warning to motorists that they may meet vulnerable road users. Whilst waiting for the riders to arrive by the Safe Lanes signs, where Sheila was going to take some photos, she talked to, and gave out leaflets, to walkers, cyclists and people in the car park at Black Hill. Photos and video clips of the ride were shown at the meeting.

PCSO Bioletti talked about riders and motorists all having the right to be on the road and each having responsibility to consider the needs of each other, which is exactly what the Safe Lanes group promotes. She was thanked for giving her talk and told that the Safe Lanes In Pendleside group welcomed and fully supported the initiative.

The Council reported on progress and consulted on current issues in the community. We discussed car parking, event management and building/ planning matters in the village, all of which were important issues to residents and businesses alike. I was also able to give an update on the transfer of the car park and associated toilet facilities from Pendle BC to the Parish Council, the responsibilities associated with that and our current finances. I was pleased to receive general endorsement for the Council's actions.

We had updates from the various groups in the village including Nancy from the WI, Chris from the Village Hall and James, our Borough Councillor. We then tucked in to wine and food provided by the Cabin which kept us going until it went dark, thanks to all those who made the effort to attend and I trust you enjoyed the evening and catching up with acquaintances.

For those who did not attend, I would again say that

the appearance and general prosperity of the village does not come without parishioners making an effort because nobody else will do it and you should have your say. Those who attended and some others who could not attend make all the difference and I thank them all for the time they put in to making our hamlet clean, tidy and well maintained.

There was a whopping 83% turn-out for the parish council elections which exceeded the parliamentary and borough election turn-out. By a small majority all the previous councillors were re-elected. Our Lengthsman will be in Goldshaw Booth this month undertaking various tasks in preparation for the Best Kept Village Competition. Please make a special effort to make our community look beautiful for the summer.

We are pleased to report some reduction in the amount of dog fouling in Goldshaw Booth during the last month but we are concerned that fouling is still taking place on Spenbrook Road between Spen Brook and St. Mary's School. The council will be

putting up signs on this section of road to remind dog walkers that fouling can cause illness as well as being dirty, anti social and uncaring.

Council is still concerned about the lack of care for the community shown by Ingham and Keers as the mill is demolished. It has come to our notice that at least one resident has been hurt on the site. The perimeter fence is down more than it is up allowing direct access to the site, contrary to HSE directives on demolition sites. Council has written to Ingham & Keers expressing concern.

The Annual Parish Meeting will be held at St. Mary's School on Thursday 11th June at 7pm. It is an opportunity for everyone to meet together and air your views. We look forward to seeing as many residents as possible. Light refreshments will be served.
