Dear Friends

David Cameron's speech on religious extremism emphasised the freedoms we take for granted in this country. Such freedoms were hard won. We have just celebrated the centenary of Magna Carta which was only the beginning. Centuries of intolerance culminated in the Civil War and out of the failure of a religious settlement in 1660, we have become used to tolerating different religious



expressions. In the 19th century the struggle of Charles Bradlaugh and others brought freethinking into the centre of public life. So the freedoms we take for granted were hard won in the face of intolerance.

Such freedoms are usually expressed in 'freedom to'. Curiously in the Bible freedom is 'freedom from' - freedom from slavery, freedom from sin and death. Instead the prevalent value is love. We are all familiar with the two great commandments - love God and love your neighbour. But in Deuteronomy there is also the command to love the foreigners living in your land! And Jesus really laid down the gauntlet when he said, 'Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you'.

There is a perception that love is sentimental and soft. In reality love is putting the needs of another person first even at a cost to oneself. In a society that loved the neighbour and the foreigner, love would play out in concern and compassion. More than that it would result in building relationships that spanned social, economic, religious and racial differences. Religious extremism flourishes where differences are emphasised. That's why it is so lacking in love and fuelled on hatred. As well as inviting people to embrace the values we take for granted, perhaps we need to find ways to enable them to feel valued.

From our boundaries with Barley & Blacko and almost everywhere in-between, most of the village has had some care and attention:- all the benches have been treated, post boxes painted, all the signposts have had a coat of black, as have the noticeboards, the two AONB signs at Blacko Foot and Noggarth café have been completely touched up, the stone surface at the car parking area opposite the school has been relaid, white railings touched up and grassed areas strimmed and tidied. The bouncy animals have also been touched up and refitted, on a new spongy mulch matting, courtesy of a grant from Pendle BC. 

Barley Parish Council

On Monday 7th September, Stage 2 of the Tour of Britain Cycle Race will roll around the hills and leafy lanes of the Ribble Valley and Pendle, including a visit to Barley. The stage will start at 11am in Clitheroe and finish about 3.15pm in Colne town centre after 100 miles of cycling, but early in the afternoon the peloton will travel along The Avenue into Barley, then head through the village and start the third and final "King of the Mountains" climb of the day up to Annal Cross before descending into Downham. Some of the world's top teams will take part including Sky, Garmin, Movistar and Etixx Quick Step. Top riders include the Tour de France winner Chris Froome and Mark Cavendish. (if fit)

We are all being encouraged to get involved by Pendle & Ribble Valley Councils by watching the event and decorating our villages and roadways to add some raz to the occasion. The climb up Barley Lane is sure to be very popular with many spectators because you can get close to the action then zip off to Colne to watch the sprint finish – weather permitting, it will be well attended even on a Monday.

Barley Lane and Barley Road will be closed to traffic as will many other important roads in the area including sections of the A59 and the Fence by-pass. Local residents will be given access. More information will soon appear in the press and on roadside signage. The PC will be engaging with the event management team to try and ensure road closures are kept to the minimum required.

The application for outline planning permission to build five houses at Barley House Farm, on the site of the farmyard and agricultural buildings, has been re-submitted to Pendle BC (13/15/0290P) and has just closed to public response. The proposal is to split the site into five self-build plots with access road and services to each. There are no details on the type of building, quality or style at this point, but if approved, each plot owner will be responsible

Did you know that The Pendleside Charity Tractor Run started in August 2009? It was set up in memory of local Pendle farmer Andrew Nutter who was diagnosed with bone cancer in 2008 and sadly passed away in 2009 at the age of 39. Andrew who farmed at his family farm in Sabden Fold had a real passion for tractors old and new and all types of machinery. A tractor run would have been his idea of a good night out!

Since it began and over the last 6 years we have raised over £19,000, giving money to many different charities including MacMillan Cancer Care, Northwest Air Ambulance, Royal Blackburn Hospital Chemotherapy Unit, Pendleside Hospice and Rosemere Cancer Foundation.

The route starts at Sabden Old Hall Farm, going through
Higham then Fence, Wheatley Lane, Barrowford,
Higherford, Blacko, Roughlee, Barley, Newchurch and
then will finish back at base. The estimated village
"passing through" times will be released very soon.

While driving the route there will be opportunities to donate money to the charities. This year our charities are The Chemotherapy Unit at Royal Blackburn Hospital and Rosemere Cancer Foundation.

This event has made so much money for charity because of the general public who generously donate. Please come and watch, and donate what you can!

Thanks to Lisa Pollard for collecting the splendid sum of £167.24 from residents of Newchurch to purchase plants for the garden. Council is indeed most grateful for all of your efforts.

At last we have now filled the vacancy on the Council, Councillor Chris Burt proposed that Mr Andrew Cowell be elected as a Co-opted Councillor. This was seconded and all members were in favour of Mr Cowell joining the council. The position had been vacant since February 2014.

Planning Applications. Council agreed that Borough Councillor James Starkie will insist on seeing any samples of stone to be used on the development of Spenbrook Mill in the future, or on any buildings proposed in the AONB.

LCC Highways Department has posted notices to the effect that the footpath is going to be improved from Spen Brook up to Newchurch week commencing 27 July - August 7.

Communications to residents of the Parish will be discussed at the August 11 council meeting. Lengthsmen have cut the roadside grass bank by the school. The Picnic tables have been treated with wood preservative.
