

Dear Friends

Over the summer I have been reconnecting with Ernest Hemingway, the great American writer and larger than life character. I'm currently reading For Whom the Bell Tolls. The title comes from a sermon preached by John Donne who was the Dean of St Paul's, London in the 17th century. In it, Donne reflects on the connectedness of all human beings. He says, 'Any mans death



diminishes me, because I am involved in Mankinde'. At that time England was on the edge of Europe, but it had managed to isolate itself from Europe which was caught up in religious wars that lasted some thirty years. John Donne's perspective on the human race was certainly not narrow.

It is an amazing statement and one which resonates with a lot that is happening in the world today. We can feel remote from events happening abroad in the relative security of East Lancashire. But some of us have come close using the Channel tunnel to get away for our holidays. It would be easy to see those migrants at Calais as a problem but Donne's words challenge us to think of them differently. What is happening to them affects me, not in economic terms or as an inconvenience, but because we have a common humanity.

And then there is the ongoing persecution and murder of people of different faiths at the hands of so-called Islamic State terrorists. Christians, Yazidis and Shi'ites are given the choice, if they are lucky, of slavery or death if they do not convert. Syrian Christians find it hard to understand why Christians in the West aren't doing more to protest and protect. The one initiative that has rescued Syrian Christians has been initiated by a Jew, Lord Wiedenfeld, in acknowledgement of his debt to Christians who rescued him and countless others from Nazi Germany.

Donne's take on our common humanity is not biological. It came from his Christian faith that God loves the people of this world so much that he gave us his only Son for the world's salvation. Being on the receiving end of God's love should bind us all in love and mutual compassion.

There will be rolling road closures all along the route headed up by police motorcycles. Barley Parish Council

Many will be aware that the topic of conversation and e-mail during the last two weeks of August has certainly been the planning application which has been submitted to erect a 20m high communications mast near Aitken Wood and several have written to Pendle to register their support or objection to the application.

The last date for lodging a comment was Friday 21 August and it is now with Pendle Borough Council for consideration of all relevant planning policy, both local and national together with the responses to consultations and residents comments. The due date for the decision is noted on PBC website as 18th September unless it is referred to the Barrowford and Western Parishes Committee, in which case it will probably go to the October meeting.

Please do not forget that the Parish Council is not the decision-maker on planning applications, we are a forum for discussion and we use our best endeavours to assess applications, gauge opinions and pass comment to the planning authority. As with all planning applications affecting the area of Barley and the AONB, the Parish Council is committed to prioritise the protection of the AONB and this special landscape in which we live and this application has been treated no differently.

Turning from mobile phone reception to mains gas supply, some of you, along with residents in other Pendleside villages have received a letter from Andrew Stephenson MP regarding a scheme which could potentially bring mains gas to some properties. This is obviously in its very early stages with more details and information to come.

At the most recent meeting of the Parish Council, we were pleased to welcome five Newchurch residents. They came regarding the Parish Council's suggested type of planting up of the Millennium Garden. Villagers' preference is for a flower garden, which should be a focal point at the entrance to the village. A meeting was then held on-site with the Lengthsman, who offered his help and advice on the matter.

Councillors discussed the suggested email system to be set up by Cllr J Parsons in order to improve communications with residents. Letters have now been delivered to all residents in the Parish to ascertain if they wish to be involved in the scheme or not.

Councillors were pleased with the work that has been done on the footpath between Spen Brook and Newchurch, but disappointed that only parts of the path have been resurfaced.

We are pleased to report that Burnley and Pendle Ramblers Group has presented the Parish Council with a cheque for £250 to help with the upkeep of the toilets in the village. Group members are appreciative of the fact that they are being kept open for the use of all.

We were sad to receive the resignation of Cllr Barry Starkie due to on-going health problems. Our thanks for all Barry's past help and technical advice, and best wishes to him for the future. The Statutory Notice for his replacement has been posted on the notice boards.

ROUGHLEE

I have it on good authority that the proposed road closure during September that we were advised of relating to Pasture Lane has been downgraded with the drainage works now taking place whilst the road is open. This will obviously cause some minor inconvenience but at least it is better than a full road closure. Let's hope that they complete the work without having to revisit it later.

Planning has dominated the agenda during August with the proposal for a 4 bed house to be built in the "old tea gardens" at Happy Valley. (Planning ref. 13/15/0325P). This is a highly emotive subject given that the individuals concerned are long serving Roughlee residents and it does pose problems for the wider community in the precedents that such developments, if passed, could present in the future. Our clerk Carol has declared that she intends to stand down from her position at the end of this financial year after giving us more than 6 years of sterling service. With this in mind, we are obviously looking to replace her and would welcome any enquiries from interested parties. It is a paid position and requires somewhere between 4 and 10 hours work per calendar month (this does includes the monthly parish council meeting). If you are interested then please give me a call 2691482 to discuss this further and perhaps we can get you to speak with Carol to fully understand what is involved. On a more positive note, we have had confirmation from the BKV judges that we have progressed to the next stage, with further visits from them planned during August. As stated last month, the village is looking very well and that is down to the band of individuals / volunteers who give up their own time to keep it that way. (I know that we keep saying it, but, "Thank You"). Our next shop window is the Tour of Britain cycle race [qv] which passes through the village just after 2pm. If you are able, please support this, it will be quite a spectacle. Get your flags out, paint your bikes red, white & blue - you could spot vourselves on the tele! Martin Schofield

St. Mary's Church Restoration News Since the discovery of the dry rot between the organ and the tower wall we are pleased to be able to tell you that we have made good progress. We were given an "Emergency Faculty" by the Chancellor allowing us to remove the organ and initially treat the dry rot. The organ has been removed and the dry rot spores and fruiting bodies on the wall have been professionally disinfected. This is a first treatment intended to halt the spread of the dry rot for the time being. The organ was found to have a little more damage than we first thought but is being assessed at the moment by the organ restorer. We will know more when he makes his report. The next stage in the building work will be to remove the plaster from the tower wall and then do a careful examination to find the extent the spores have travelled. We cannot do this until we have legal permission from the Diocese of Blackburn (This is called a Faculty).

While we are waiting for the Faculty from the Diocese we are preparing an "Our Heritage" Heritage Lottery Fund Application for financial assistance towards the project. St. Mary's meets most of the criteria for this type of grant. One essential aspect of the grant application is that we provide a range of supporting activities. Some activities will relate to the organ and some to the building. The other supporting activity relates to the history of the church and how we share that information. This is an area where we would appreciate your help.
