#### SAFE LANES IN PENDLESIDE

Further to Derek Heap's article in last month's Parish News regarding speeding motorists and fatalities on rural roads. At the March meeting of SLIP a campaign by the BHS (British Horse Society) called Dead Slow was brought to the attention of the Group. In the five years since the launch of the BHS's horse accidents website, over 2000 incidents of road accidents involving horses have been reported. Of these 36 caused rider deaths and 181 resulted in a horse dying from its injuries or being put to sleep. 75% of accidents happened because the vehicle passed the horse without allowing enough space. THE MAJORITY OF THESE HAPPENED ON A MINOR ROAD AND IN A RURAL AREA. The counties with the highest number of accident reports are Essex with 155, Kent with 89 and LANCASHIRE with 81. The figures from ROSPA which Derek guoted, and those from the BHS quoted above, highlight the dangers of speeding traffic on rural roads. SLIP would urge all motorists to slow down when passing horse riders, cyclists and walkers. PASS WIDE AND SLOW. Also, slow down when approaching a bend. You don't know what might be around the corner. EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED. SLIP erected a road safety mirror at the cross roads at Black Hill, Sabden in 2006. The mirror has proved an invaluable aid to anyone exiting the junction from the car park side. Unfortunately, sometime around the middle of April thieves have sawn through the post and stolen the mirror. The police have been informed. This matter will be discussed at our next meeting on Tuesday 31 May at Roughlee Centre starting at 7pm. Anyone wishing to attend would be most welcome. Sheila Clegg

Following on from the Annual Parish meeting, which over forty parishioners attended, the Council was able to review the feedback we received on a wide range of issues, but particularly the endorsement for the key challenges we are currently confronting, including parking issues, management of events held in the village and our stance on planning matters within the village and the wider AONB. The meeting was very well attended and it gave the Parish Council, the Village Hall Committee, the Church, the WI and the Borough Councillor the opportunity to discuss a range of issues and the meeting was very interactive. After the meeting had finished the excellent buffet and buckets of wine flew off the shelf as if a plague of alcoholic locusts had passed through and the last hour was a relaxing and enjoyable social event.

The issue of parking restrictions were discussed at length and feedback was received from residents on retaining the turning area and the introduction of road lines and bollards in the village centre. Then there was a focus upon where the Council should spend our money with residents asked to show their support or otherwise for car park, toilet, village green and

playground improvement projects – the village green received the most votes.

Judging for the Best Kept Village is about to start. The flower beds in the car park, around the War Memorial and the Playground will soon be planted and grassy areas mowed and strimmed. We would ask all residents to do their bit to keep the village as tidy and attractive as possible – hopefully we can regain the title of BKV.

Nigel Dewhurst has had to stand down as a Councillor due to work commitments and so we thank him for his efforts over the last couple of years and we seek to recruit a new councillor who we hope can add to the skills already on the Council.
