Dear Friends

In this year of centenaries I have been reading quite a lot of history books. What I've discovered is that instead of helping to build

certainties about things past, historians often raise doubts about the received account of events. Instead of establishing what actually happened, we are left with interpretations of what happened and why. It is as though there is gap between history and story-telling. We live in an age often called post-modern, although it's been around for long enough to have become post-post-modern. It is a philosophy that no longer thinks of absolute truth out there, but of context and perception. It can be disconcerting. We all want certainty. However sometimes it can be useful. The Danish philosopher Kierkegaard once said, Life can only be understood backwards; but it must be lived forwards. So history becomes a journey into the future which involves risk and faith, but when we look back we can see patterns. And that helps us continue forward.

One of the benefits of the Heritage Lottery Funding for St Mary's has been the historical research being done by a small team. It is uncovering all sorts of fascinating tit-bits – archaeological, historical, documentary and personal. What makes it so fascinating is that it is not just dry remnants of the past, but part of a time-line of which we are the latest moment.

Often people think the only history in Pendle is the unfortunate condemnation of twelve people for witchcraft. Instead we have a tapestry of people's lives revolving around the church and its worship. Look out for the results on the church website, the exhibition on September 3rd-4th and the new church history.

GOLDSHAW BOOTH PC

This financial year has seen Goldshaw Booth Parish Council, along with other parishes, having to carry out work previously completed by Lancashire County Council. There comes a point when it becomes a waste of time to keep asking LCC to carry out its responsibilities and we have to get on and do the jobs ourselves. The Parish, in the form of Carl Ryder, has therefore recently strimmed the public footpath between Spen Brook and Newchurch and both sides of Spenbrook Road between the two hamlets. Next year we will pay for a contractor to do these jobs. It may well be that the precept will have to increase to pay for the extra work that is needed to be done to maintain the public paths and roadsides in our parish. Residents will understand that the extra work that is now falling on the Parish Council will have to be paid for. Perhaps if residents have a view on this, they could attend a Parish Council meeting and let councillors know. All of the Parish Council accounts are now on our website so that everyone can see what our income and expenditure is. At the last Parish Council meeting we had a presentation from County Councillor Christian Wakeford about purchasing a speed indication device (SID). This would be a joint purchase with other local parishes and the SID would be available to each for about two weeks at a time, in rotation. The device could be placed on Spenbrook Road and its presence would hopefully deter motorists from speeding. It is early days yet and we await further details.

Parish Councillors put a great deal of unpaid time and effort into running the parish and would appreciate occasional help from volunteers. If you wish to help maintain and improve your village, then please contact me or any one of the Parish Councillors, as there are always jobs to do.

ROUGHLEF

The Parish Council meeting of 1st August spent some time on planning matters. Three visitors spoke on a proposal for an agricultural building on the higher ground above Thorneyholme Farm. Whilst not expressing outright objection the Council was concerned about the size of the proposed building. Also, against a background of possible further farm sub-division in the future, should the relatively small holdings which result warrant their own building when the original farm buildings remain? This is perhaps a problem with wider implications for Pendleside. Also on the planning front the Parish Council has received a hard copy from Pendle Borough Council of the new Development Plan Part 1 (Core Strategy) and information relating to the forthcoming Part 2 plan. These plans are important to the future of the village and we need to engage fully with any future consultation

The recurring issue of Himalayan Balsam was discussed. This attractive plant is invasive and efforts to prevent its spread are necessary if local species are to be protected. Parish Council members and volunteers have been taking action to remove flowering heads but much of the growth is on private land and in inaccessible places. This year's season is drawing to a close but if the problem is to be tackled in the future co-ordinated action along Pendle Water is necessary earlier in the growing season.

Following a fallen tree into the river opposite Wood Close I am pleased to report that the Environment Agency responded to the problem within 48hours of our alert. They not only dealt with the problem but checked the safety of the river wall and carried out further obstacle clearance upstream. So, well done to them.

The word is that Roughlee will not go forward to the final stages of the Best Kept Village competition this year. At the moment I have no feedback on the assessment but lessons learnt will be carried forward.

Finally, and perhaps most important, is a plea for volunteer helpers at the Senior Citizens Christmas Lunch. The success of this annual event has rested on a few villagers who help with preparation, service and clearing up. This year two of our stalwarts are away and we are, therefore, in desperate need of new helpers.

The likely date for the event is 15th December. No cooking skills are necessary so if you could lend a hand please let us know by contacting our Clerk, Mary, roughleeclerk591@gmail.com or any member of the Parish Council.
