

GOLDSHAW BOOTH PC

Our congratulations go to Barley for their excellent success in the BKV. As far as Goldshaw Booth is concerned, Spen Brook improved its position over last year to 4th place in its class but alas Newchurch was unplaced. This is a disappointing result as the PC had put in a great deal of time and money to present Newchurch in its best possible light. The Millenium Garden was completed, the exterior of the toilet block was painted and wall baskets fixed to it, as well as planting the bed in front of the block. Extra barrier baskets were fitted and the old water trough planted up, and, the amount of mowing in the Parish was increased. The Parish Council is naturally disappointed, as I'm sure Newchurch residents will be too, but we await the detailed judges' report before the Council can comment further.

The Council employed Latham Brothers to cut the verges on Spenbrook Road and they have completed this recently. They have cut the hedges as well and the area looks much tidier as a result. Following on from the last magazine article the Council will employ them to cut the verges on Spenbrook Road in May and September next year and not rely on LCC. We will also have both sides of the public footpath between Spen Brook and Newchurch mown at about the same time.

Christian Wakeford has worked very hard in bringing the project of a speed indicator device to reality and has secured agreement to share the cost with four local parish councils as well as grant aid accessed by Cllr. Wakeford. This will be an agenda item at the next Council meeting in October where we will vote on the matter. Residents are of course welcome to hear further details about this very important subject. Himalayan balsam is a widespread and serious problem countrywide. This invasive species spreads quickly and prevents other plants growing. It is important that, if this plant is found growing within your property boundary, it is destroyed as soon as possible before it spreads to neighbouring properties. Christopher Burt

ROUGHLEE

Following an appeal for helpers at this year's Senior Citizens' Christmas lunch I am pleased to report that we have received a positive response but a couple more would help to spread the load. The date is now confirmed as <u>Thursday</u> 15th December. The Mayor and Mayoress have agreed to attend and the children from Roughlee School will bring a joyful presence. Other entertainment is being arranged.

September saw the marriage of Glen Watson and Lynda Lewis and celebrations were held at the Village Centre. Congratulations to the happy couple from the Parish Council.

Footpath and river bank issues have again been to the forefront. The riverside path from Roughlee to Whitehough was badly damaged late last year when very high river levels were experienced. More recently a section of the path adjacent to Thorneyholme Cottage has become badly cracked possibly because the high river retaining wall at this point has been undermined. There is no doubt that this section of the path is potentially very dangerous and thanks must go to the land owner who quickly implemented a diversion away from the danger. This riverside path is heavily used throughout the year by both local people and visitors and its poor condition is a cause for real concern. Having spent some time contacting various agencies and going round in the inevitable circles it is clear that any meaningful repair work will be difficult to arrange and will not happen swiftly. This is a case where persistence and determination are called for.

New planning issues have surfaced since our last report. We have learnt that a proposal for a new house on the corner Ridge Lane and Blacko Bar Road, opposite Yate House, has been approved on appeal. It had been refused locally but the Planning Inspector considered that it would not cause harm to the AONB and would help to meet a local housing need.

Another planning matter relates to a proposal to convert the barn at Thorneyholme Farm into three cottages. The application has just been put out for consultation but comments must be made by 4th October. The Parish Council will consider the application at its meeting on 3rd October, so if residents have comments they wish us to consider that is the deadline.

Clarice Holmes passed away peacefully at the Royal Blackburn Hospital on Sunday September 18. Whilst she hadn't enjoyed the best of health in recent years, she was still enjoying life, but took a turn for the worse the previous week. Her Daughter Jennifer was able to fly over from America to be with her; sadly Jennifer's elder sister Janet died just a few months ago.

Clarice married Bert in 1946 and the family moved to Happy Valley Tea Rooms in 1964. Following the floods in 1967 they moved to the family home in Judson Fold.



She worked for a time as dinner lady at Roughlee School. She launched herself into Roughlee life, with the Village Centre Committee, as a volunteer for Age Concern and 30 years ago started the weekly Luncheon Club which still runs today. During her life Clarice made many friends, all of whom she held very dear.

In 2011 her long service was recognised by the then Mayor of Pendle, Cllr. Shelagh Derwent. She was a regular attendee at Barley Chapel where the Celebration of her Life service was held. Our deepest sympathies go to Jennifer and all the family which includes four grandchildren and four great grandchildren.

My final comments relate to the failure of Roughlee to make progress in this year's Best Kept Village competition. Whilst congratulating Barley on their success, Roughlee Parish Council has decided to take a fresh approach. One strand of this is to invite villagers to re-form the "Friends of Roughlee's Appearance" group to take forward ideas for the future. It is hoped that the first meeting will be early in 2017. Meanwhile thoughts and expressions of interest will be welcome by the PC.

The church history research is revealing even more interesting details as we look at the records from 1750 to 1830 held by Lancashire Record Office. For instance we now know that the chandelier cost £6.3s.0d in 1756 and was brought from Wigan to be fitted in church. The cost of 2 trips to Wigan and the hire of horses was £1.3s Od. (£1.15)

INSPIRING WOMEN

Speaking at Barley WI last month, Dr Ruth White from Newchurch, told us how she first became fascinated by microbes when as a young child,

her father encouraged her to look down his microscope at the hospital where he worked. Many years later, she is now a Consultant Microbiologist at the Royal Blackburn Hospital. She talked about tetanus and trench foot which is seldom seen now (except at Glastonbury!). Meningitis has been greatly reduced by the production of vaccines. Today's problems are MRSA, other Staphylococci, Streptococci, Salmonella and E.coli.

She then went on to describe the new automated system in the Pathology Department at Blackburn and talked of a technique which can identify a bug in 20 minutes!

Dr White made a challenging subject interesting and answered many questions from members.

At the end of the meeting, President Nancy Cookson reminded the members that Lancashire WI have asked for Teddies to be knitted to be given to children in the UK who have suffered any sort of tragedy. Some are given to children in Refuges, others are given out by Fire Services to comfort a child following loss of toys in a fire or flood. One member, Norma Holden from Roughlee has already knitted 13 Teddies!
